# Wilson Street Legacy Banners

A walk through 200 Years of History!

**Perth, Ontario -** On Thursday, April 19th, 2012, the first in a series of the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Legacy Project banners will be unveiled along Wilson Street. The banners will trace 200 years of Perth's history and provide a visual gallery for visitors and residents to learn more about our community. Beginning in 1816 at Foster Street, the banners depict Perth's military settlement. The banners will then progressively tell the story of Perth over the decades ending at 2016 at Hwy #7 with imagery from the Perth Kilt Run. Throughout the decades, the banners portray economic, social, architectural, and cultural developments that have served as important measures of Perth's progress over 200 years.

The new gateway feature to Downtown Heritage Perth is the first Phase in the Legacy Project that which will honor our history and heritage. Phase two of the Legacy Project will see more color introduced through landscaping, tree planting, and wood carvings. Over the next four years, the Town encourages residents to participate in the beautification of Wilson Street as the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Legacy Project continues to enhance this gateway even further.
